a. Councillor Noel re: Debris and Drug Paraphernalia Collection by City Employees.

b. Councillor Noel re: Old Tree Stump at Cooper Park.

Councillor Tardiff stated the City had issued an Expression of Interest for carving the tree stumps and Mr. Nesbitt advised the Closing Date for the Expression of Interest is October 23, 2024. It was noted members of Council had seen several comments on this project on Facebook. Councillor Noel withdrew the Motion before the vote.

c. Councillor Noel re: Deer Population.

Councillor Price advised a Deer Committee had been formed and a report provided to Council during her first term of Council. Councillor Noel advised the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) and a biologist can do a managed hunt which should be looked into. Councillor Tardiff asked for information on what had been done in 2017 and 2018. Mr. Nesbitt advised

staff could provide this information to Council and spoke to the ideas and results of the 2017-2018 study. Following more discussion staff were directed to bring this issue back to a future meeting for review of the 2017-2018 study and current discussions with the MNR to see if there is anything new that can be done.

Mr. Poole noted Capital Projects for 2024 continue. He also advised that funding applications and work on the 2025 Capital Budget are keeping people in his department busy. Mr. Poole advised Todd Olson, the City's new Operations Manager, would be starting work September 30, noting that Daryl Pollard will be missed when he retires in November. He thanked the Ministry of Natural Resources for the work they're doing in the Laura Howe Marsh, noting they're removing danger trees, underbrush and fallen trees.

e. Director of Community Services

Mr. Boyer advised that Aaron Park had wrapped up another successful season and that the Golf Club would be open until Thanksgiving weekend, weather dependent. He advised a new Zamboni would be arriving soon and that a Request for Proposals for a wrap had been issued. Mr. Boyer congratulated Ms. Walter, the City's Museum & Heritage Coordinator, on winning the Community Spirit Award at the recent Chamber of Commerce Awards.
