Dryden Food Bank	Weekly purchase of milk products to address calcium deficiencies.	87167 3042-RR-0001	\$46,750	The Dryden Food Bank relies heavily on community donations and does not have a guaranteed operating budget. The program had 489 households access the food bank on a regular basis and distributed 4,799 food hampers to 547 individuals in 2021. The Moffat Family funding provides a variety of food items, particularly fresh milk, eggs and calcium products that help to ensure that clients are eating healthy and able to maintain healthy calcium levels.
Making Connections for Children and Youth	Universal Recreation Program for Children & Youth	10759 1356-RR-0001	\$11,750	Universal Recreation Opportunities benefiting children & youth in the Dryden area. Program goal is to enhance the lives of youth by providing sponsorship for cultural, recreational and leisure activities to those families facing financial barriers to accessing those activities. Sponsorships to a variety of more than twenty sports, organizations, clubs, camps and lessons are available and aid children in developing leadership skills, empathy, good sportsmanship, respect for others, ownership of actions and good citizenship.
Dryden Food Bank	Refrigerated Storage Unit	87167 3042-RR-0001	\$15,000	Application for funding to aid in the purchase of a refrigeration unit in order to store second harvest food that is available. Current storage within the facility has been maximized over the past few years including the addition of freezers and refrigerators and they are now out of options for additional storage within the current building. The refrigeration unit would be placed on their property and allow them safe food handling options for the second harvest foods.
The Board of Health for the Northwestern Health Unit	Nutrition on Weekends Program	10778 5800-RR-0001	\$16,750	The Nutrition on Weekends program seeks to increase food availability and nutrition to students in connection with existing school-based meal and snack programs, who have been identified as having insufficient access to healty foods druing the weekend. The second objective for the program is improved academic success in educational outcomes and school attendance for children who are recipients of the Nutrition on Weekends program. The program has seen huge growth in need over the past two years. In Dryden and Surrounding Area, six schools are operating the program and serving over 160 students.
Dryden Food Bank	Home Delivery Program	87167 3042-RR-0001	\$3,000	Seeking assistance to offset costs of providing a home delivery service in order to overcome the barrier of mobility for those struggling with food insecurities. Specific focus of eligibility would be seniors, people unable to access the food bank due to a permanent or temporary disability, single parent homes with large family and no means of transportation, and individuals or families that the Manager deems eligible. Funding would be used to cover the operating costs of a vehicle.
Dryden Public Library Board	Expansion of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library	11923 0449-RR-001	\$6,750 \$100,000	Imagination Library is a program that provides one free book per month to every enrolled child from birth to the age of 5. Currently there are 105 children receiving a book each month, representing approx. 30% of the children eligible. Funding would allow them to double this number over the next year. The application also includes support for programming relating to the books the children receive in the form of craft kits.
